Kia ora Parents, Caregivers and Whānau,

By staying engaged in learning activities during holiday breaks, learners can reduce the risk of experiencing learning slippage and maintain their progress towards their educational goals.

It has been a busy but rewarding term of learning and next term is shaping up well to provide opportunities for our learners to continue to grow as great people. With events next term such as the gym festival and the Weetbix try challenges, quickly approaching, we will be hitting the ground running.
