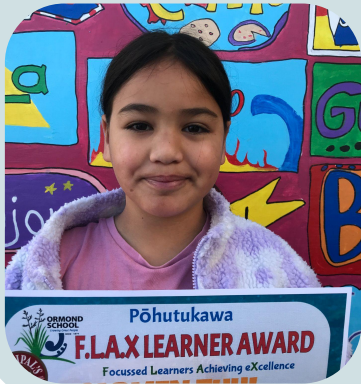
Daisy

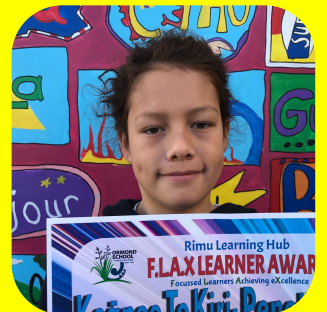
Carmen

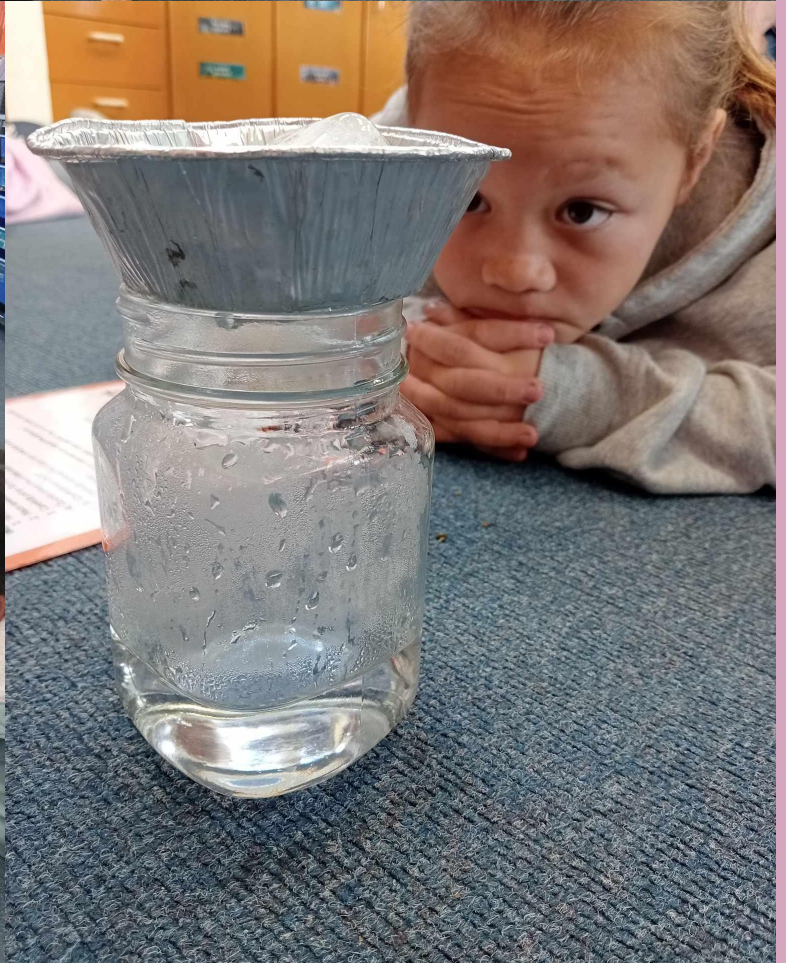
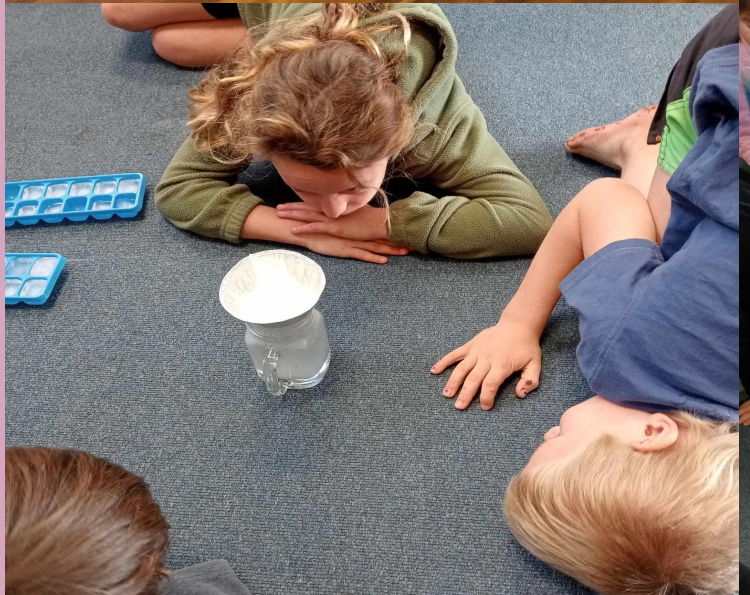
