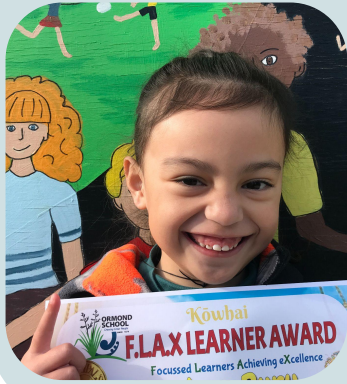

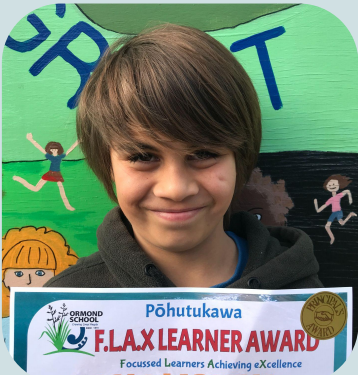
Arlo

Ka mau te wehi.

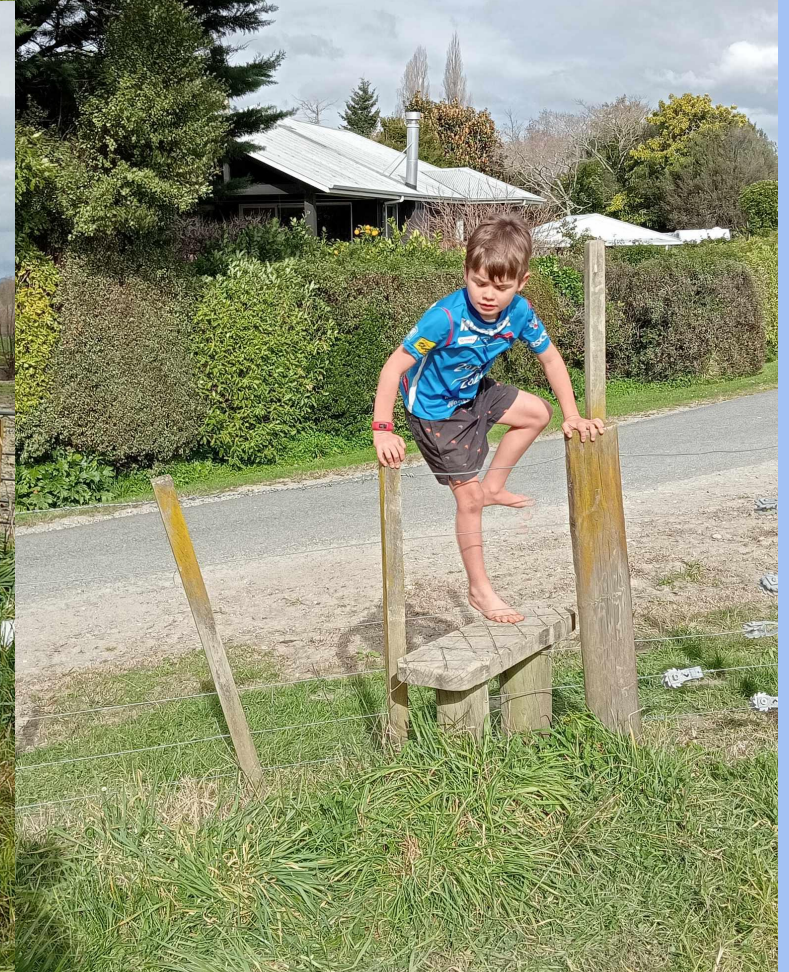
